You were wearing Tiffany's coat. I take after you on the food spilling! You loved coming to DaySpring to stay the weekend and celebrate the holidays with the family. At Christmas, you were in charge of putting the hooks on the decorations for all of us to decorate the tree. Your seat of honor was to sit in Rosemary's grandmothers rocking chair. When you were 85 you were interested in drag racing. You would come with the family pit crew and watch me. I am so proud to be one of your seven kids. I love you Mom and I will miss you very much.
