Marbeiter, Georgeine Mae, nee: Moore, was born on August 8, 1952 to Earl Moore and Helen Wilber Moore in Durand, MI. At a young age they moved to Manistee, MI. where she started school. Later moving to Mason County and graduated in 1971 at Mason County Central in Scottville, MI. She has an older brother Earl Moore, older sister Marleine McKerracher, and a younger sister Orleine (Kay) Smalley; many nieces and nephews.

She met and married her best friend and soulmate, Eugene C. Marbeiter in 1972, they moved to California where they spent several years in the Navy. Later they moved to North Dakota for Trinity Bible Institute. They were blessed with three wonderful children, Kevin G. Marbeiter and Keith A. Marbeiter, and Tanya R. Marbeiter.

Georgeine later worked in Duval County School System in Jacksonville, Florida for 13 years as a teacher's assistant and interpreter for the deaf and hard of hearing. After retirement from the military, Georgeine and family moved to Clearwater, Florida. She worked as a preschool teacher for several years until she was forced into medical retirement. Georgeine was diagnosed with fallopian tube cancer in January of 2008. She fought a long battle since then with many other medical issues taking place. She was preceded in death by her parents, Earl and Helen Moore; mother in law Dorothy Marbeiter; brother in law Earl McKerracher; husband Eugene and daughter in law Dawn Marbeiter. She is survived by her three children and only grandchild Rachel Marbeiter, who is her sweet pea and pride and joy.

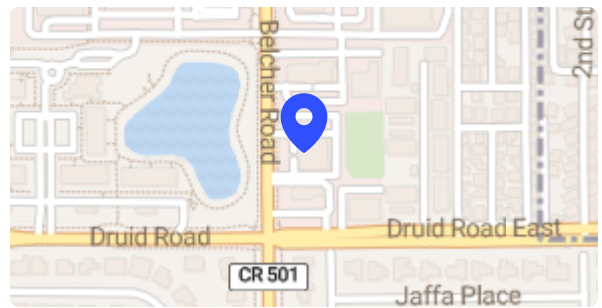

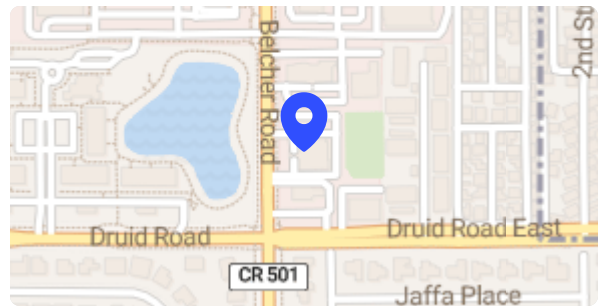

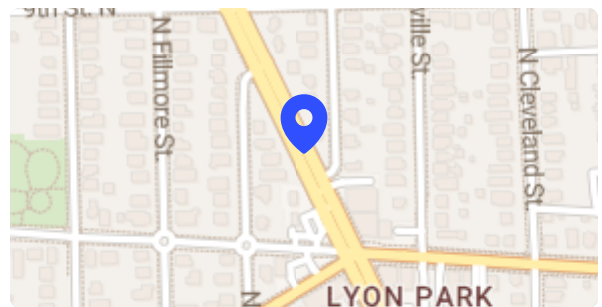

George, We were together from the beginning to the end of this long journey. You sure fought a long hard battle...losing your hair so many times, but coming right back and starting all over again. You were dealt a full deck of cards and you played everyone of them to the fullest. We did not have a lot in common growing up because I was the older sister and heaven for bid I could not be seen with my little sister. As we did age I would call you and do all my ironing while talking to you on the phone (1 to 2 hours or more) and our husbands would say " you just talked to each other this morning how can you have so much to talk about now." Then after our husbands both passed away, we would call each other anytime of the day and sometimes 3 and 4 times a day. We found we had so much in common. When we got talking about making greeting cards, forget it if you were someone trying to call either one of us. I am so going to miss hearing you on the other end of the phone. Even though you were so set in your own ways (not me) and no one could change that. Whenever we had a disagreement, we would just move on with our lives. I would call you and try to explain what I just purchased at Michaels or Hobby Lobby and then the next day you would call me and tell me what you went and bought. I loved to surprise you every time I flew to Florida. I would just knock on your door and you would cry every time and say "what are you doing here" Then you would say "your not going to ever surprise me again," think I surprised you 5 or 6 more times....but you loved it....now no more, now maybe I will have to start surprising Tanya and Kevin...George there is no more worrying about them, Tanya is doing a fantastic job and Kevin is dealing with it very well. Your little girl has grown up and taken on your responsibilities very well. You would be very proud of her. You loved introducing me as the "older sister" and that was fine with me, because that I was. I miss you and love you very much...Till we meet again Love "Mar"

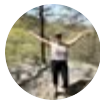
