**M**arjorie C. Young, 92, died peacefully December 3, 2017, in Clearwater, Florida. She and her husband, Walter S. Young, Jr., lived in Toledo, OH; Darien and Greenwich, CT; Houston, TX; The Landings in Savannah, GA; and The Eagles, Odessa, FL. They were married 65 years.

Born in Alton, IL, May 12, 1925, Marjorie graduated from Monticello Preparatory School and Connecticut College, New London, CT., Marjorie and her husband raised three children and she was a loving wife, mother and grandmother.
