Ida M. Infanti, 94, died peacefully holding hands with her niece, Linda on June 15, 2020 in St. Petersburg, FL. Born in New York City in May, 1926, she studied at Immaculata High School in NYC, and graduated from Fordham University. She became a Teacher and worked in the NYC school system teaching “her kids.” She was assigned to schools PS19 in Corona and PS89Q Elmhurst. She also taught at PS 49- The Dorothy Bonowit Kole School gifted program. Aunt Ida cared about her kids making sure they were always dressed properly for school buying clothes for those who couldn’t afford it and a good meal to eat each day.
