She grew up and was educated in Beaver Falls graduating from Geneva College with a Bachelors Degree in History. After graduation she worked for her father in his auto electric repair business performing most management duties to relieve her father of stress on his failing health.

When the Korean war broke out in 1950, she married her surviving husband Steiner, a marriage that would last 70 years until her death.

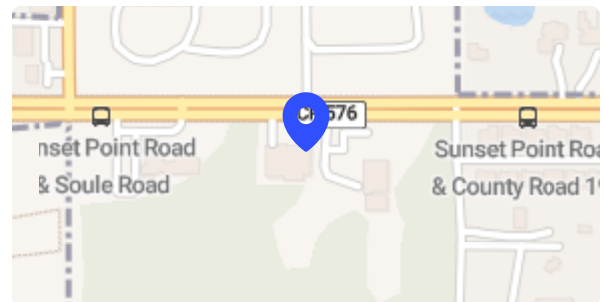

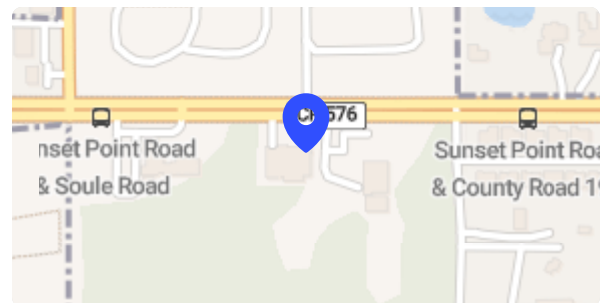
