Nannie Jane Klecka of Safety Harbor, Florida passed away on Tuesday, May 14, 2024 at Mease Countryside Hospital in Safety Harbor. She was 76 years old. The daughter of Bedford and Elsie (Shelton) Noble was born on July 9, 1947 in War Creek, Kentucky.

Born in Kentucky, Nannie was the oldest of 8 children. As the oldest, she quickly assumed the role of not just “the big sister” but almost a motherly role to her younger siblings. She loved her family dearly! Nannie took care of everyone and worried about everyone except herself!

She attended and graduated Middletown High School in Middletown, IN. Nannie fell in love with her high school sweetheart, David Shuck. The two were married and had two children together, Kimberly and Bradley.

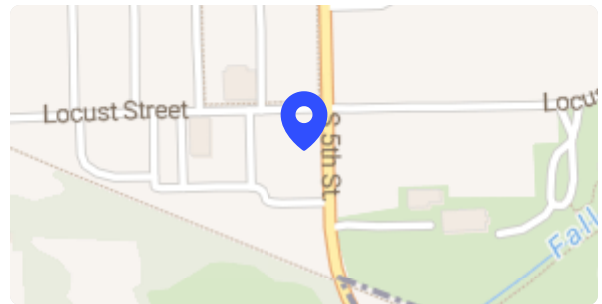

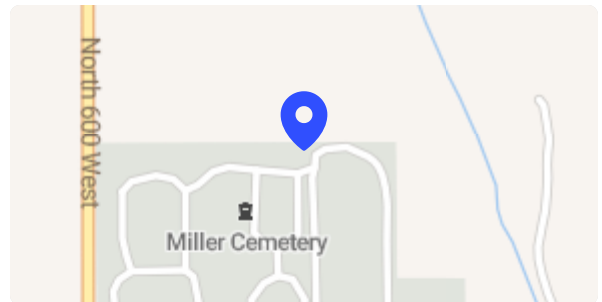
